

## punchdrunk enrichment

What happens when an audience is cast as the protagonist of an adventure? Led by Punchdrunk Enrichment's newly appointed Artistic Director, Steve McCourt, this participatory session will explore the company's signature approach to creating narratives that cast the audience as the heroes of an immersive experience. Teachers will leave armed with exercises to offer their students, and a framework designed to aid their creative and devising processes. Students will go on to create work that places the audience at the heart of the story as they are offered a pedagogical approach steeped in positivity, purpose, and endless possibility.

<u>Punchdrunk Enrichment</u> was founded in 2008 to take the innovative practice of Punchdrunk into schools, community and family settings. Originally part of Punchdrunk, the company became an independent charity in 2021 and is now based in Brent, London. Today, it is a National Portfolio Organisation dedicated to creating transformational, immersive experiences for as wide an audience as possible.



In this Splendid-style workshop we will be looking at how to devise new work using physical characterisation, chorus, and vocality, whilst rooting the work in socio-political perspectives. The session will be about quickly and accessibly making sense of theory that can sometimes feel abstract on the page. Gen will bring with her a toolbox of techniques, exercises, and approaches to stimulus, leading an energetic workshop that will quickly get you on your feet... get ready to move!

Commedia dell'arte in the classroom: A Practical Toolkit for KS3 Teachers

Join us for an energetic, one-hour workshop designed to inspire and enrich your KS3 drama teaching practice. This session will awaken the physical performer within you, building your confidence to model expressive, physical theatre in the classroom. Through engaging, accessible techniques, you will begin to develop a toolkit for teaching commedia characterisation and physical comedy, rooted in the stock character movement repertoires. The workshop offers quick and adaptable exercises you can immediately apply to explore slapstick, silent movies, clowning, pantomime, Shakespeare, and, of course, commedia dell'arte itself. You will leave with handouts including historical context, character cue cards, and a ready-to-use commedia scheme of work—plus a fresh set of ideas for approaching classic texts and comedy units with creativity and confidence.

<u>Learning Through Theatre</u> is an educational theatre company offering global shows and workshops for students, teachers, and performers, both online and in-person. They specialise in commedia dell'arte and physical theatre, including workshops in masks, mime, comedy, puppetry, and storytelling.
